

DIY Succulent Planter

1. Pick your container. For this project, we chose to repurpose an old chicken feeder! Regardless of what style of container you choose, be sure it allows for good drainage.

2. Pick your potting soil. Make sure you get a potting that doesn't retain moisture. Succulents do not like wet feet, so you want to be sure that the excess water is able to easily drain from the container.

3. Pick your plants. There are so many different varieties of succulents out there. Pick your favorites based the colors and textures you enjoy. I used two different varieties of Hens and Chicks that I broke off from their momma plant.

4. Pick your accents. Decorative rock. We used 1" egg rock. There are lots of different kinds of decorative rock to choose from, so just pick the colors and textures that are most attractive to you!

5. Establish roots! Bury the stems (or existing roots) in your potting soil. That's it! Succulents are incredibly easy to care for, which is one of the many reasons why they are so popular.



Pro Tip:

Do NOT overwater succulents. These plants retain water in their leaves, stems, and root systems, so they need little extra water. Let the soil dry completely before watering again.
